
From dramas to documentaries, comedies to musicals, the 2017 Indian Film Festival of Melbourne is set to showcase the finest selection of colourful and vibrant films.

Starting out in the Indian film industry, Adil Hussain has performed in Hindi, Assamese, Bengali, Tamil, Marathi, Malayalam, English and French films. He is known in the west for his role as Pi's father in the epic survival drama *Life of Pi*, directed by Ang Lee. Most recently, Adil received the Special Jury Award at the 2017 National Film Awards, for his role in the acclaimed family drama *Mukti Bhawan* (Hotel Salvation) screening at IFFM 2017.

Alankrita Shrivastava

Committed to delivering engaging female - centric stories, Alankrita Shrivastava is one of India's most progressive filmmakers. Alankrita makes movies with a powerful message designed to send shockwaves and empower women. The undaunted director's latest film, Lipstick Under My Burkha is a modern and empathetic depiction of intrinsic - if not taboo - female desires. On the 2017 international film circuit, the daring film has already bagged 10 awards. Lipstick Under My Burkha is testament to Alankrita's honorable mission to tell stories about the complexities of living as women.



Aishwarya Rai Bachchan

Heralded as "the most beautiful woman in the world," Aishwarya Rai is one of India's greatest exports. The Indian Film Festival of Melbourne is delighted to welcome this iconic actress-model-humanitarian to our celebration of diversity and cinema.

Rai famously quit architecture to pursue modelling and never looked back. She became a household name in India with just one line in a Pepsi commercial. In 1994 she was crowned Miss World. Then came the movie offers.

Her breakthrough role in *Hum Dil De Chuke Sanam* (1997) earned her a Filmfare Award for Best Actress. *Devdas* (2002) earned her a second and made her world famous. She's graced big budget hits like *Dhoom 2* (2006), *Jodhaa Akbar* (2008), *Enthiran* (2010) and *Ae Dil Hai Mushkil* (2016) while subverting expectations with arthouse auteur Rituparno Ghosh in Chokher Bali (2003) and *Raincoat* (2004). She may, however, be even more famous as the face of L'Oréal, Fuji, De Beers diamonds, Pepsi and Coca-Cola.



India bestowed on her their fourth-highest civilian award, the Padma Shri, for her contributions to the arts. But she's also used her fame to promote humanitarian causes, like the campaign to eradicate polio, and is a UN spokeswoman for using microcredit to alleviate poverty.

Karan Johan

One of Indian cinema's preeminent Renaissance men, the last two decades have seen Karan Johar recognised as a talented writer, director, producer, TV host, costume designer and author.

The son of acclaimed producer Yash Johar, founder of Dharma Productions, Karan entered the film industry as an assistant director before writing his directorial debut with 1998's Kuch Kuch Hota Hai. The coming-of-age drama starring Shah Rukh Khan dominated the 1999 Filmfare awards, picking up Best Film, Best Director and all four major acting awards, introducing Johar as a powerful new voice in the industry.

Johar's second directorial effort reunited him with Shah Rukh Khan, starring as the son of an wealthy industrialist who's love for a woman (Kajol) is forbidden due to her socio-economic status. *Kabhi Khushi Kabhie Gham...* cemented Johar's ability to tackle sensitive topics with a deft touch and a compassionate eye; a skill that

he would continue to master in *Kabhi Alvida Naa Kehna* (2006), *My Name Is Khan* (2010), and *Ae Dil Hai Mushkil* (2016). Taking over Dharma Production in 2004, Johar has found enormous success as a prolific producer, bringing to screen *Kal Ho Nah Ho* (2003), *Kapoor & Sons* (2016) and *Dear Zindagi* (2016), all of which found significant critical and commercial success.

An inimitable and beloved figure, Karan has been a constant and popular personality across a range of television shows. Since 2004, Johar has hosted *Koffee with Karan*, a celebrity interview show noted for its humour and wit. Karan has also been a popular host at the Filmfare Awards and The International Indian Film Academy Awards, held in New York. Johar is also a seasoned judge on India's Got Talent and has presented *Jhalak Dikhhla Jaa* since 2012.

An *Unsuitable Boy*, Karan's memoir, was released earlier to massive anticipation and brought to light the peaks and valleys of a career spanning over two decades and covering his relationship with some of India's biggest stars.









Konkona Sen Sharma

Konkona Sen Sharma's achievements in Indian art house and independent films have assisted to propel her profile to that of a leading actress in contemporary parallel cinema. Starring in an even spread of English, Hindi and Bengali films, Konkona delivers a diverse performance. Konkona Sen Sharma was awarded Best Actress for *Lipstick Under My Burkha* and best director in her first film, *A Death in the Gunj* at the 2017 New York Indian Film Festival.

Malaika Arora

Malaika Arora was a founding VJ and host of MTV India, going on to become interviewer, model and producer for blockbusters such as *Dabangg* and *Dabangg* 2. A glamorous fashion icon, Malaika co-presented *Loveline* and *Style Check* with Cyrus Broacha. She is currently a highly regarded judge for talent shows *Jhalak Dikhhla Jaa* and *India's Got Talent* alongside Karan Johar.

Nitesh Tiwari

Formerly a creative director at international advertising agency Leo Burnett, Nitesh Tiwari is now an acclaimed writer, producer, and filmmaker. Nitesh made his directorial debut with the light-hearted drama Chillar Party, winning the Indian National Film Award for Best Children's Film. Forging a very successful career as a filmmaker, his newest multi-award winning film Dangal, starring Aamir Khan, is so far India's highest grossing film. The biopic drama, regarded as Bollywood's best film of the decade, has won many awards including the 62nd Filmfare Best Director Award. Nitesh Tiwari is now regarded as one of the most talented and successful members of the Indian film industry.


Onir

A true auteur, Onir is an acclaimed director. screenwriter, editor and producer. He is best known for his film Mv Brother...Nikhil. a film based on the life of Dominic d'Souza, starring Sanjay Suri. It was one of the first mainstream Hindi films to deal with AIDS and same-sex relationships. He has won numerous awards for My Brother...Nikhil and his film I Am, which consists of four short films exploring such themes as single motherhood, displacement, child abuse and same-sex relationships. Onir's most recent films, Aaba (producer) and Shab (director/producer/writer/editor), starring Raveena Tandon are both screening at IFFM 2017. They are a testament to Onir's narrative range and continual quest to explore human connection.



Rahul Bose

Actor, director, screenwriter and social activist, Rahul Bose is renowned for his work in parallel cinema. In addition to Rahul's impressive performances in several Bengali and Hindi Films, such as *Pyaar Ka Side Effects, Jhankaar Beats, Mr. and Mrs. lyer*, Rahul is respected for his social activism, the founder of antidiscrimination NGO, *The Foundation*. Earlier this year, Rahul released his film *Poorna*, starring young newcomer Aditi Inamdar as Malavath Poorna, the youngest girl ever to climb Mount Everest.



Rajeev Masand

Rajeev Masand has held an accomplished media career spanning 20 years, covering the Indian entertainment industry. In his distinguished career as a film critic and journalist, Rajeev has interviewed the likes of Martin Scorsese, James Cameron, Hrithik Roshan and M. Night Shylaman. Rajeev was awarded 'Best Entertainment Critic' by the National Television Awards, in 2008, 2010 and 2011. Currently host of India's most popular film talk show, *Rajeev Masand Ki Pasand*, we are very happy to announce Rajeev's return to IFFM 2017.

Rajkummar Rao

In 2013, Rajkummar Rao played the role of Govind in the film Kai Po Chel, for which he was nominated Best Supporting Actor award at Filmfare in 2014. That same year, he was awarded the Filmfare and the National Film Award for Best Actor and Critics Best Actor for his portrayal of Shahid Azmi in the biographical drama Shahid. Rajkummar Rao comes to IFFM 2017 with his latest release, Trapped, directed by Vikramaditya Motwane, in which his character, Shaurya is locked in an uninhabited Mumbai apartment.





Raveena Tandon

Raveena Tandon is a critically acclaimed actress, producer and model. Raveena attained mainstream recognition early in her career; however it was when she ventured into more serious roles in arthouse and parallel cinema that she flourished. Winning the Best Actress Indian National Film Award for her performance in Kalpana Lamji's Daman: A Victim of Marital Violence, Raveena's characterization has been met with widespread acclaim. Her more recent role in Shab is garnering similar amiable attention for it's poignant exploration of human relationships.

Satish Kaushik

With over three decades of experience as an actor, writer and director, Satish Kaushik is a legend of the Indian film industry. Known in India for *Mr. India* (1987) and *Jaane Bhi Do Yaaro* (1983), Kaushik has also seen international success with the British drama *Brick Lane* (2007), starring Tannishtha Chatterjee. With over 100 acting credits to his name and over a dozen directorial efforts under his belt, Satish Kaushik is a formidable creative force and it is our honour to have him in-house to introduce his latest project, *A Billion Colour Story*, alongside writer/director Padmakumar Narasimhamurthy.



Shobu Yarlagadda

An Indian-American environmental engineer turned film producer, Shobu Yarlagadda is the co-founder and CEO of Arka Mediaworks, an acclaimed film production company renowned for it's Telugu cinema focus. Shobu's recent two-part film series *Baahubali* became the highest grossing films in their release years and cumulatively, the highest grossing film series in India. No stranger to accolades, Shobu has won a National Film Award as well as two state Nandi Awards and Filmfare South Awards for his work.

Highly respected for her diverse career, marked by a long list of accolades in Indian and international cinema, Tannishtha Chatterjee is India's 'Princess of Parallel Cinema'.

Tannishtha's international credits include Joe Wright's Anna Karenina and Garth Davis's recent critically acclaimed Lion.

In 2016 Tannishtha was honoured with a Special Award at the BAFTA and London Asian Film Festival for her contribution to Asian Cinema. Recently, Tannishtha has won Best Actress awards for her biographical role in *Doctor Rakhmabai* as well as for her role last year in IFFM 2016 Opening Night film *Parched*.

Taran Adarsh

Taran Adarsh has led a successful career as a film critic, journalist, editor and film trade analyst. Critiquing his first film at just 15, Taran was bound for the business, proceeding to become a producer and screenwriter for *Hello Bollywood* and *Fox*. In 2007, Taran began hosting talk show B BIZ, giving box office reports and entertainment industry interviews.



Vikram Phadnis

Vikram Phadnis is one of India's leading fashion designer. Vikram's designs have been worn by India's biggest stars including Salman Khan, Vidya Balan and Priyanka Chopra. 




Lipstick Under My Burkha












Writer, actor and producer, Damien Hill is best known for his Melbourne made film *Pawno*. Acting for over ten years, Damien has featured in various Australian movies *Spin Out, Fell* and *The Broken Shore* as well as a role on Australian iconic TV drama, *Neighbours*.
