


community and culture that attracts more than 35,000 people each year.

Chief Guest - Shah Rukh Khan


Shah Rukh Khan, popularly known by the initials SRK, is an Indian actor, film producer, television personality and a philanthropist. Referred in media as the 'Badshah of Bollywood', 'King of Bollywood' and 'King Khan'. He has appeared in more than 80 Bollywood films, and earned numerous accolades, including 14 Filmfare awards. For his contributions to film, the Government of India honoured him with the 'Padma Shri'

Furthermore, he has been awarded the Ordre des Arts et des Lettres (Order of the Arts and Literature) award by the French government for his exceptional career.

His fame does not stop here; following release of his films overseas he has been credited as the world's biggest movie star and was named among the 50 most powerful people by Newsweek.

He started out his career by appearing in several television

serials during 1988-1990. He made his film debut with the commercially successful Deewana (1992). He began to achieve success at the box office from his villainous roles in films such as Darr (1993), Baazigar (1993), and Anjaam (1994). Some of his popular films include Dilwale Dulhaniya Le Jayenge (1995), Kuch Kuch Hota Hai (1998), Devdas (2002), Om Shanti Om (2007), and Chak de India (2007), Don 2 (2011), Chennai Express (2013) and many more.



Chief Guest - Shah Rukh Khan

Even with all the success and a statue among the elite in Madame Tussaud's, he is quoted as being one of the most humble and down to earth personalities albeit his wit is unmatched by even the best in business. His larger than life persona continues to win hearts all over the world with a fan following going into billions.

Amaal Mallik is an Indian music director, playback singer and lyricist in the Hindi film industry hailing from a family who has been in the music business for generations. Following the legacy, he debuted in 2014 by composing three songs for acclaimed films Jai Ho (2014) and Khoobsurat (2014). In 2016, he earned two nominations for Filmfare Award for Best Music Director for Kapoor & Sons (2016) and Baaghi (2016). One of the youngest and brightest in the business, he is popular for touring all over the globe and mixing various genres such as Jazz, Electronic, Indian Classical and Pop. His work resonates with the youth and is crucial for the landslide transformation within the Indian music industry.



Arjun Kapoor

Arjun Kapoor is an award-winning actor with a history of exploring commercial success and critical acclaim. Beginning his career as an assistant director for Kal Ho Naa Ho and Wanted, he made his debut with Habib Faisal's Ishaqzaade (2012). In his ever-growing career that began 7 years ago, this heartthrob has chosen roles that most young actors would shy away from. He has played a villain, the boy next door, a Kabaddi player and a police officer. The choices and span of his work reminds us why he is one of the fastest growing and most loved actors today. When he isn't making movies, the actor also spends his time with his football team, Pune City FC and tours with them proving that he is really invested in everything he does.


Gayathrie Shankar

Guneet Monga

Founder of Sikhya Entertainment - a boutique film production house — Guneet Monga has graced us with some of the most influential and celebrated films in recent Indian cinema. With festival-trotting films such as Gangs of Wasseypur, Masaan, The Lunchbox, Monsoon Shootout, to her credit, and now an Oscar win for Period. End of Sentence, Ms Monga has challenged the norm of Indian cinema and allowed audiences to experience different realities. She has also become one of the first Indian producers to join the Producer branch of the Academy of Motion Pictures Arts and Science.



Karan Johan

Karan Johar fondly referred to as KJo is a maverick filmmaker with a career expanding decades. His first footsteps into cinema were guided by his late father, Indian film producer Yash Johar, founder of Dharma Productions. Now a father himself with adorable twins, lovingly named Yash Johar and Roohi Johar, (after both his mother Hiroo and father Yash) this screenplay perfectionist celebrates the best of Indian cinema in all his creations.

Karan Johar isn't afraid to wear many hats; An Indian film director, producer, screenwriter, costume designer, actor and television personality, he is regarded for his individual style. His gamut of superhit romantic movies and family dramas continue to grace, excite and entertain the Indian film audience.

Directing movies such as Kuch Kuch Hota Hai (1998), Kabhi Kushie Kabhi Gham (2001), Kabhi Alvida Na Kehna (2006), the critically acclaimed My Name is Khan (2010), Student of the Year (2012) and Student of the Year - 2 (2019). Karan Johar has established himself as one of India's film icons.

His enthusiasm and penchant for perfection translates into his non-commercial masterpieces as well, having directed for Netflix alongside Zoya Akhtar, Anurag Kashyap, and Dibakar Banerjee for the series Lust Stories (2018) praised for its exploration of female sexuality, a subject rarely dealt with in Indian films and Bombay Talkies (2013) earning positive reviews from critics.

Adding to his list of talents, this visionary continues to surprise by choosing his pen over the clapper, when he celebrated his debut as the author of An Unsuitable Boy, an autobiographical book written and published in 2016.





Jahnu Barua

Mr. Jahnu Barua is a critically acclaimed visionary of parallel filmmaking in Indian cinema. His dedication towards highlighting a common man's issues in films, bagged him 12 National awards for films like Aparoopa and Bonani. Mr.Barua's approach to filmmaking is true story telling, no matter how difficult a story it is to tell. The director has a way with bringing the toughest issues to the fore because he believes cinema isn't just for entertainment, it is for 'improving one's mindset' as well. He is one of the pioneers of Assamese cinema and it is his films like Firingoti, Halodhia Choraye Baodhan Khai and his latest, Ajeyo, that have not only put the multifaceted and extremely talented filmmaker, but also Assamese films on the map. The Indian Government honoured him with two of its highest civilian awards, the 'Padma Shri' and 'Padma Bhushan' for his contributions to the country in the field of cinema.

Malaika Arora

Malaika Arora is a Bollywood sensation, a producer, an actress, dancer, model and a television presenter. Apart from being known for her iconic dance numbers Chaiyya Chaiyya, Munni Badnaam Hui and Gur Naal Ishq Mitha, Malaika Arora is a fitness guru and an entrepreneur who owns a yoga studio chain in India. She has been a festival supporter since its inception and was at the forefront of helping the festival win its name in the Guinness Book of World Records for the largest Bollywood dance in 2011. Her unwavering faith and belief in the festival as a dance competition judge and a city of Melbourne lover makes her the perfect guest at IFFM 2019.





Mayur Katariya

Mayur Katariya has been honing his craft through writing, directing, shooting, editing and producing ten short films, two music videos and a number of corporate videos. His short film, Forgetfulness, which he wrote, directed and produced, was accepted by eleven international film festivals. Ek Aasha (2018), Mayur's first feature film as writer and director, sees all transgender roles acted by transgender people. The film was awarded the Best Film and the Best Director in India International Film Festival, Pune. Mayur also was awarded the Best First Time Filmmaker, Australia Independent Film Festival.

Nikhil Pherwani

Born in Mumbai, Nikhil Pherwani started out directing non-fiction TV shows. Drawn to cinema, he assisted Amole Gupte on Stanley ka Dabba (2011) and Madhur Bhandarkar on Dil Toh Baccha Hai Ji (2011). He then directed his first short film, Chana (2012). Ahaan (2019), his feature directorial debut has been funded and produced independently over a four-year period.



Onir

A true representative of inclusivity and diversity, Onir is an acclaimed director, screenwriter, editor and producer who celebrates movies through breakthrough scripts. His film I am bagged a National Award for being the best Hindi Feature Film in 2011. Onir has also produced and directed the multi Award winning documentary, Raising the Bar, shot in India and Melbourne. This year he is back with yet another moving documentary - The Widows of Vrindayan



Priya Serrao

As Miss Universe Australia 2019, Ms Serrao believes in giving back to the community and using her platform to support organisations that promote diversity and inclusion. She will become a certified lawyer in the supreme court this year and has also received two prestigious degrees from Melbourne Law School, in both Arts and Law.

Priya Ramasubban

Priya Ramasubban is a reputed filmmaker who has traveled the world for over fifteen years making films for National Geographic, Discovery, History Channel and other major international broadcasters. She is a storyteller at heart and has the ability to deal with complex subjects in a nuanced way allowing for textured interpretation. She has written and directed Lost Kings of Israel (National Geographic), Divine Delinguents (National Geographic), several episodes on the long-running series Digging for the Truth (History Channel), episodes on the series Into the Unknown (Discovery Channel), an episode on Monster Fish (National Geographic) and several others notable productions. Priva was one of the six people chosen from all over India as a part of a screenwriter's lab organized by the National Film Development Corporation where she recieved an opportunity to evolve her story for Chuskit under the mentorship of award winning Dutch writer Jolein Laarman.



Ranjan Ghosh

Ranjan Ghosh is a writer-director who is critically acclaimed for celebrating Bengali cinema. His directorial debut *Hrid Majharey*, became the first Bengali movie to be shot on an Indian archipelago of the Andaman and Nicobar Islands. *Ahaa Re* (2019), is a soulful melange of authentic Bengali cuisine savoured with specs of romance between a chef and home-chef, screening at IFFM for its Australian Premiere



Rajeev Masand

Rajeev Masand is one of India's renowned film critics and columnist, with a vibrant career reviewing numerous movies for over two decades. As part of being an influential entertainment journalist, Mr Masand has conducted famous interviews with big names like Martin Scorsese, George Lucas, and Guy Ritchie, alongside Bollywood stars Amitabh Bachchan, Shahrukh Khan and Dhanush. He has written and worked with India's leading news organizations and is one of the first few journalists that began actor roundtable interviews in India. Over the last 4 years, Rajeev has hosted panels, been a member of the jury and promoted the festival amongst audiences worldwide through interviews and articles.

Rima Das

A perfect embodiment of self-taught and self-made; Rima Das paved a new way for independent cinema in India. Without any prior experience, Ms Das created her first feature film; Paratha in 2009. Her first feature film Antardrishti (Man with the Binoculars), shot completely with a Canon DSLR gained her international recognition. Her second film, Village Rockstars, apart from winning 4 national award categories at the 2018 National Awards in India, has also been awarded 11 film festivals across the world. Her style of filmmaking is weaving a story that is visually stunning, warm but most importantly emotionally relatable. This year she will be screening her 3rd feature venture, Bulbul Can Sing, at IFFM 2019!



Rituparna Sengupta

Rituparna Sengupta, the sensational Bengali actress and producer, made her on-screen debut with a Bengali TV series called Sada Paira (1989), following which she featured in the National Award-winning Bengali film - Shwet Patharer Thala. Ms Sengupta has won the National award for her role in Rituparno Ghosh's dystopian flick titled Dahan. This is the second time she will be visiting IFFM with a new film. The talented actor has worked in various industries in the country and continues to mesmerize audiences with her roles.



Sanjay Routray

Sanjay Routray is an acclaimed executive and line producer who has worked on numerous award-winning films such as Andhadun (2018), Johnny Gaddar (2007) and Kaalpurush (2005). His production was nominated for the 'Filmfare Award for Best Film' and he has been associated with some of the top directors in Bollywood such as Anurag Kashyap and Vishal Bhardwaj for a long time now. He further produced two films with the famous Bengali director, Buddhadeb Dasgupta, which premiered at the Toronto Film Festival. These films went on to win the National award for 'Best Director' and 'Best Film' respectively in consecutive years.


Sapna Bhavnani

Actor, spoken word artist, hairstylist, writer, director, producer- Sapna embodies it all as a visionary and change-maker. Sapna is currently writing a book tentatively titled "Chapter One," and is the Creative Producer for the award-winning film Mehsampur. Her directorial debut documentary, Sindhustan was picked as one of the 24 films to pitch at DocEdge Kolkata where it won The Griffith Film School Award and premiered at The New York Indian Film Festival in May where it won Best Documentary Feature. The film has since travelled to AIFF and OIFFA. Recently, Sapna was awarded the "IBelieve" award and the "FemEmpowerment" Award for her work with ex-sex workers.



Simi Garewal

The leading lady of India's 'Rendezvous with Simi Garewal' changed the commercial citing of Indian television. Simi Garewal is a legend in the Indian film industry, some note-worthy movies include Do Badan, Saathi and Siddhartha. Ms. Garewal has forayed into writing and direction with the Hindi feature film Rukhsat for which she won the Pater's award. Since the inception of the festival Ms. Garewal has been on the festival's board and has hosted many panel discussions, interviews and a few tête-à-têtes with co-actors like Rishi Kapoor. Each year it is because of Ms. Garewal and her belief in excellence that pushes us to work harder and achieve greater heights.



Sriram Raghavan

Sriram Raghavan is a film director and copywriter, known mostly for his thriller and mystery infused cinema. Andhadhun was one of the most talked about and appreciated Bollywood movies of 2018, taking a total of nine awards. Sriram Raghavan's talent in creating clever, edge-of-the-seat thrillers have left the crowds hungry for more.

Sujoy Ghosh

Sujoy Ghosh is a film director who has celebrated a dynamic genre in Indian cinema. His direction and screenplay receive much appreciation by industry stalwarts. He has close to 13 awards to his name since his debut in 2003, and recently made headlines with his commercial success Badla (2019), screening at Indian Film Festival of Melbourne.



Tabu

Tabu is one of the leading film actresses in India. Beginning her career in 1991 she has since been in over 70 movies and won over 14 accolades. She is known across the world for her versatility and bold choice of characters. The actress has been recognized for her roles in Maqbool, The Namesake, Haider and Andhadhun. It is this versatility that has awarded her the record for receiving the most Critics Choice Awards for Best Actress in her career spanning 30 years. We are thrilled to have the powerhouse of talent with us at IFFM 2019.



Taran Adarsh

Taran Adarsh has led a fulfilling and successful career as a film critic, journalist, editor and film trade analyst. Critiquing his first film at just 15, Taran was bound for the business, going on to become producer and screenwriter for Hello Bollywood (1994) and Fox (2009). In 2007, Taran was chosen to host talk show B BIZ, giving box office reports and entertainment industry interviews. With years in the industry rubbing shoulders with Bollywood's favourites and executing his discerning knowledge in the field, Taran now lends his expertise to leading Bollywood entertainment website, Bollywood Hungama.

Thiagarajan Kumararaja

Thiagarajan Kumararaja is a critically acclaimed Indian film director and screenwriter. He made his feature film debut with Aaranya Kaandam, which earned him the Indira Gandhi Award for Best Debut Film of a Director. He has directed Super Deluxe (2019) which has gained acclaim and love due to its distinguished filmmaking, plot, and performance.





Vijay Sethupathi

Vijaya Gurunatha "Vijay" Sethupathi, is a celebrated Indian film actor, producer, lyricist, and dialogue writer who works in Tamil films. He has starred in more than 30 films and transformed into a successful and popular 'Indie-film star' in the Tamil industry. Apart from acting in movies Naduvula Koniam Pakkatha Kaanom and Super Deluxe, screening at IFFM, which garnered him a lot of audience and critical acclaim Mr. Sethupathi is also a producer. His choice of films not just as an actor but as a producer too are strong stories with interesting screenplays and visuals. He has been pushing the envelope with his choice of scripts in every film and it takes courage to do so. A trait we love at IFFM.

Vijay Krishna Acharya

Mr Vijay Krishna Acharya (also known as Viktor) is a director, screenwriter, dialogue writer, and lyricist known for his works in Indian cinema and television. He is the creator of one of the highest grossing films in Bollywood of all times. He has been a script writer and director for some of India's most renowned television shows. With his immense experience and expertise, having been in the industry for almost two decades, Mr Acharya is the perfect judge for our short film competition.
